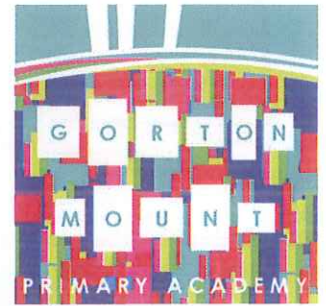


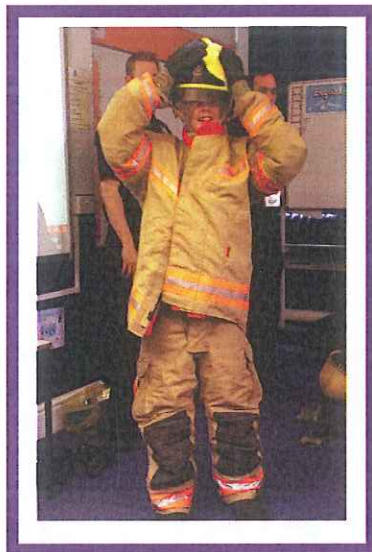
# GORTON MOUNT PRIMARY ACADEMY

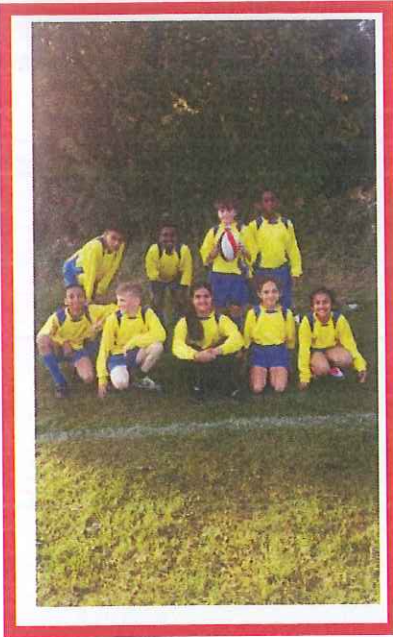
### Nursery Surestart

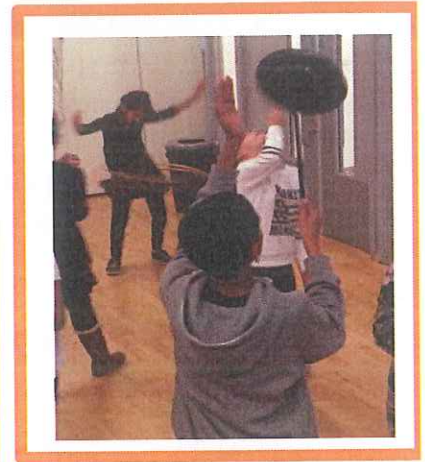

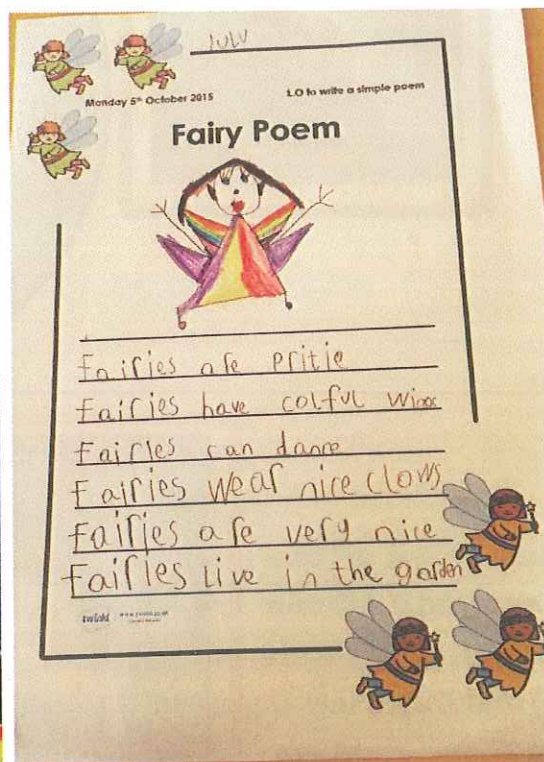
Well done to our School Rugby team! We entered a Tag Rugby competition for the first time ever. We played very well in all of our matches showing determination and sportsmanship!
